

March 10, 2026

On March 10, 2026, the Versailles Town Council met for their regular monthly meeting. All Council members were in attendance along with attorney Lynn Fledderman. Minutes from the previous meeting were approved.

A public hearing was held to discuss the Wastewater System Projects and council voted to unanimously accept the Signatory Authorization Resolution. The council also voted to accept the Per Acceptance Resolution.

A public hearing was held for the water improvement OCRA Grant Application. The Grant could be used for the demolition of the old unused water tower, new meter settings, new water lines, and replacements of old water hydrants on the square.

Randa Combs was present for South Ripley After prom and Council unanimously approved a \$400 donation.

Ben Sieverding presented the fire department reports stating that there have been 121 calls for 2026 so far. The fire department will be conducting a county-wide training event March 16th.

Cannan Water Board members Curt Altoff and Steve Lee were present and talked about Cannan Water buying water from the town of Versailles.

Mr. Sran with Nobel Properties LLC was present. He stated that the work is moving along. They recently put new windows in, and their next step is to replace doors and start drywall. Council requested pictures of the inside for next month.

Department reports were received prior to the meeting and were read and reviewed by council. Items on the consent agenda were accepted.

There was no update on the ordinance to update zoning codes.

Mainstreet Versailles stated that the back boards and goals were delivered.

The council accepted the Fire Department Fee Schedule Resolution 2026-1 with a unanimous vote.

Joe Mann thought we may need to table the new police car equipment and look for funding for a new tornado siren for the police department.

Council unanimously voted to approve The Sports Complex Parking lot repairs

There was a discussion about a new software for the office called BS&A. There will be more discussion at April meeting.

Patterson Field treatment quotes were presented and Council voted unanimously to accept them.

The council presented the Baker Tilly Bond Ordinance. The council approved the first reading. The council then voted to proceed with the Suspension of the rules. Then motioned to approve the second reading.

The council unanimously voted to accept the agreement with Baker Tilly for the Sewer Bond.

Council signed an agreement with Fleis & VandenBrink for the completion of the Water Loss Audit & Validation.

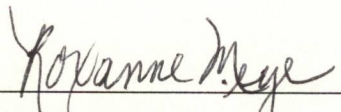
Roxanne mentioned that the stone wall by Deaglan Town Square Grill is compromised and in need of repair. Council is hoping to have quotes at the next town board meeting.

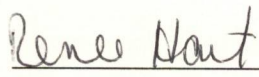
With no further business coming before council, the meeting adjourned at 8:27 p.m.

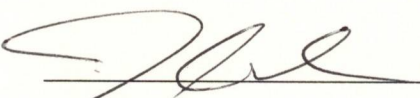
